This style applies to body. The { } groups the styles that we are using. The color is what will be effected (font color) - in this case it is set to red. This is the default color for the body of the page.

The p is for paragraph and things in a paragraph will be aligned to the center and will be 2 times the default size.

The li has a color of green so it will override the default color of font for red.
