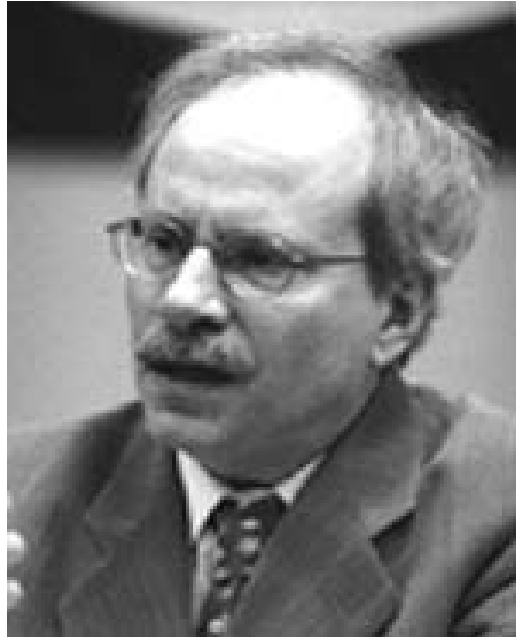

Dr. Joel Perlmann is the Senior Scholar at the Levy Institute of Economics at Bard College in New York where he teaches courses in history and sociology and guides the research program on immigration, ethnicity, and social structure. His work *Italians Then, Mexicans Now: Immigrant Origins and Second Generation Progress, 1890-2000* investigates the progress of today's immigrants to those of the past to diagnose the current condition of the American Dream.
